## Innovation for Youth Engagement and ABC Enforcement

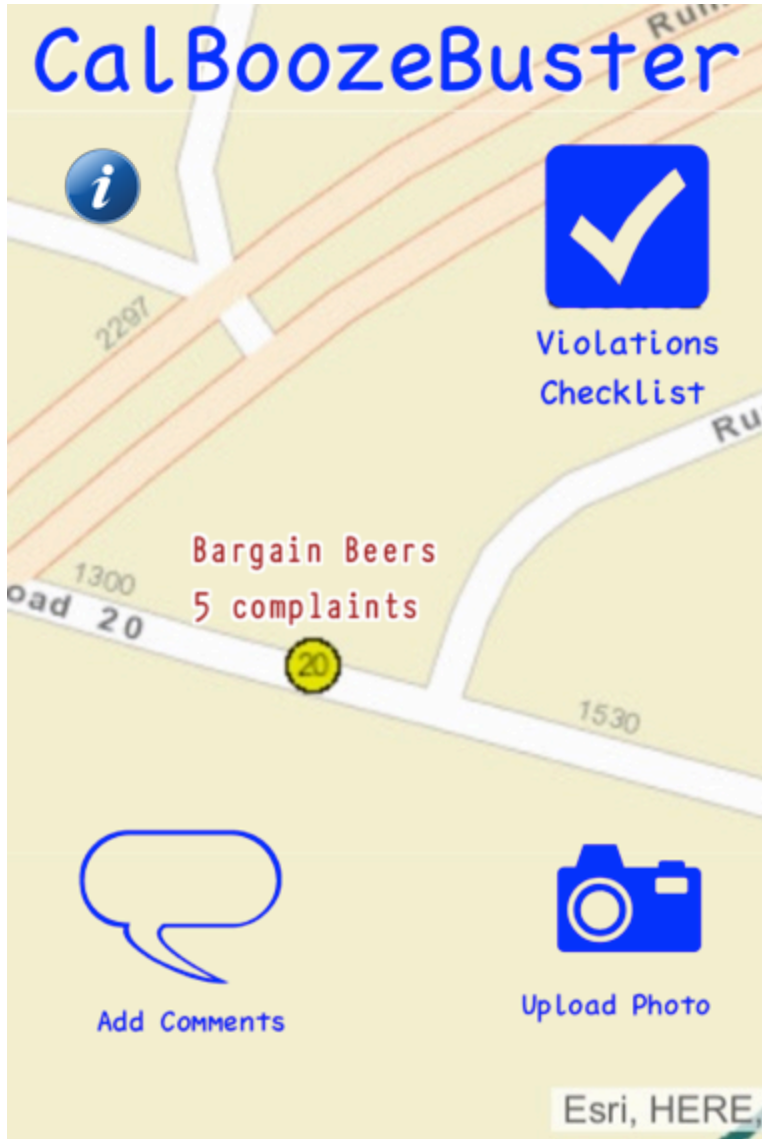

**CalBoozeBuster App** is an innovative, cost-effective program empowering youth to use smart phones to anonymously make reports to ABC of alleged youth sales. Finally, **crowdsourcing of violation monitoring** will be used statewide!

Youth will use their smart phones to report alleged violations at Type 20 and 21 licensees. **Youth drinking will decrease** from constricted access to alcohol.

ABC will be the first state agency to get real-time resident reports of violations. Less than \$50K to develop! No legislation necessary! ABC FTE savings!

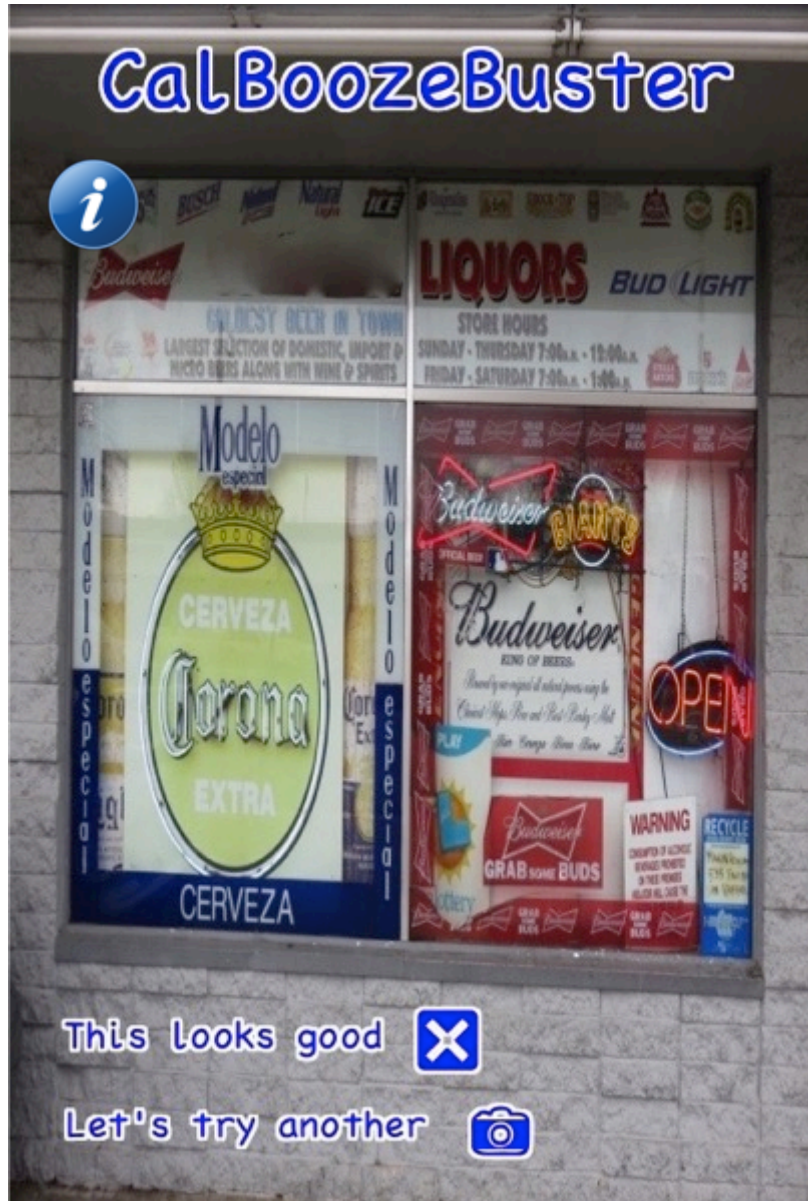


## Crowd-sourcing to Youth the Monitoring of ABC Licensee Violations

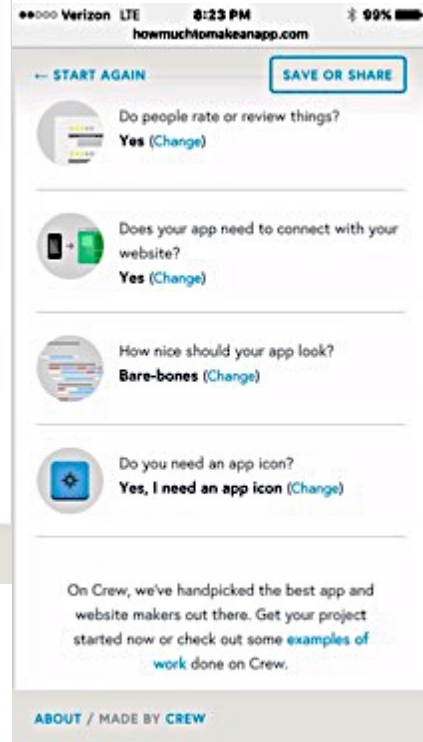
## Youth use a drop-down list of possible violations

# CalBoozeBuster

Showing a *high estimate* of ABC's cost to develop the App for iOS and Android – ABC will *save* more than that in *reduced monitoring and enforcement costs*



This is a first of its kind program:

- It engages youth and retailers
- It's easily implemented and cheap
- It will expose the retail sites where youth know alcohol is sold or made available
- It will reduce access to alcohol and reduce teen drinking
